Many individuals, students and adults, find tasks like planning and organizing their work to be insurmountable obstacles to success in school and work. Whether they have an inability to break larger tasks into smaller ones, or to establish time lines by which they can complete long term projects and assignments, these individuals “seem” to be procrastinating out of laziness or poor work ethic when in reality their resources in executive function are not sufficient to the tasks they face.
